9-Day Normandy Commemoration of D-Day \$1985

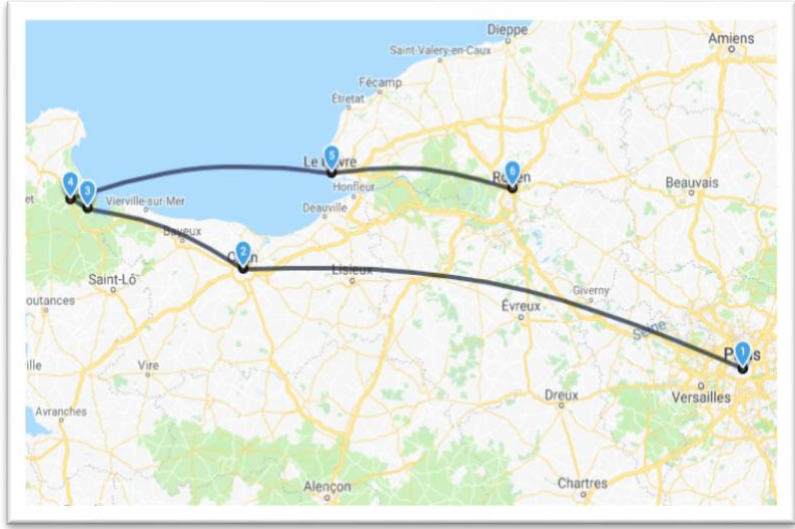
\$1985 for groups of 19 or more participants

Saturday, June 1

Travel to Paris and then explore Normandy for the 75th anniversary of D-Day. D-Day, codenamed Operation Neptune, refers to the day when the Allied Invasion of Normandy happened. This was the beginning of the end for World War II.

(Public transit, irrespective group size)

Arrive in Paris, then transfer to hotel.



Sunday, June 2

(Public transit, irrespective group size)

As opposed to other European cities, Paris does not hold many World War II vestiges but it does commemorate it through Les Invalides Museum and the Holocaust Museum.

- 10:00: Visit Les Invalides Museum.
- 13:00: Lunch
- 14:30: Visit Memorial de la Shoah (Holocaust Museum)
- 18:00: Travel to Caen.

Monday, Jun 3

Caen is the largest city in Lower Normandy and it is very close to the landings that happened in Normandy.

- 8:30: Breakfast
- 10:00: Visit Memorial de Caen, Chateau de Caen and Abbey of Sainte-Trinité
- 13:30: Lunch
- 15:00: Lecture on D-Day and the aftermath at University of Caen
- 18:00: Take a stroll through the city.

Tuesday, Jun 4

- 8:30: Breakfast
- 10:00: Abbaye des Hommes
- 13:00: Lunch
- 15:00: Lecture on D-Day and the aftermath at University of Caen
- 18:00: Free time



Wednesday, Jun 5

Depart Caen for a trip to key-locations of D-Day. Visit former battlegrounds and see canons and other weaponry.

8:00: Breakfast

9:30: Travel to Bayeux and visit Museum of the Battle of Normandy.

11:30: Travel to Sainte Marie du Mont and visit the town.

13:00: Lunch

14:30: Go to Utah Beach - see Musée du Debarquement

18:00: Travel back to Caen.

Thursday, Jun 6

Sainte-Mere-Eglise is one of the cities that has kept D-Day alive throughout the years, by commemorating the victims every year.

8:00: Breakfast

9:30: Travel to Sainte-Mere-Eglise and witness reenactment of D-Day

13:00: Lunch

14:30: Visit the Musée Airborne Musée a Ciel Ouvert

18:00: Travel back to Caen.



Friday, Jun 7

See the largest and most popular cities of Normandy. Visit harbours and quaint cobblestone streets.

8:00: Breakfast

9:30: Travel to Le Havre and see Les Jardins Suspendus, Maison de L'Armateur (Museum of the Shipowner)

13:30: Lunch

15:00: Visit Quartier Saint-Vincent, St. Joseph Church.

19:00: Travel to Rouen.



Saturday, Jun 8

8:30: Breakfast

10:00: The 7th edition of L'Armada de Rouen - a great gathering of sailing ships.

13:00: Lunch

14:30: Spend the afternoon in the city centre.

20:00: Get ready for travelling the next day.

Saturday, Jun 9, depart Normandy
